

Regulation of Import of Live Pet Dogs and Cats under the Livestock Importation Act, 1898, and Amendments Made from Time to Time – Standard Operating Procedure (SOP)

The following guidelines are hereby brought to the notice of all stakeholders regarding the import of live pet dogs and cats through the notified ports in India:

1. **ATITHI 2.0 Portal:** The ATITHI 2.0 portal, developed by the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC), is operational at all notified ports for the import of pet dogs and cats. All passengers intending to import their pets under the Baggage Rules shall apply through the portal to obtain an Advance No Objection Certificate (NOC).
2. **Generation of Advance NOC:** Upon successful submission of the online application through the ATITHI 2.0 portal, an Advance NOC shall be generated. The Advance NOC can be downloaded by both the passenger and the Customs authorities.
3. **Verification of Documents:** The Advance NOC shall be issued only after due verification of all relevant health documents of the pet, including the Veterinary Health Certificate and the pet's vaccination records.
4. **Responsibility of Airlines:** Airlines shall transport pet dogs and cats from the foreign port of embarkation only if the passenger possesses a valid Advance NOC issued through the ATITHI 2.0 portal.
5. **Responsibility of Passengers:** Passengers are required to register on the ATITHI Portal using their own passport details and must not share their login credentials or account access with any third party. Any misuse, unauthorized access, or consequences arising from such sharing shall be the sole responsibility of the passenger. No third-party involvement is required for obtaining an Advance No Objection Certificate (Advance NoC), and passengers are advised to complete the application process directly through the ATITHI Portal.
6. **Health Examination at Port of Arrival:** Upon arrival of the pet at any notified port, the Animal Quarantine and Certification Services (AQCS) staff shall examine the original documents of the pet and issue the Final NOC at the port of entry.
7. **Customs Clearance:** The pet shall be cleared by the Customs authorities in accordance with the applicable rules and regulations, based on the Final NOC issued by AQCS.
8. **Non-Compliance:** Any passenger attempting to import a pet without a valid Advance NOC, or using a fake, forged, tampered, or altered NOC, shall be issued a deportation/re-export order by AQCS in accordance with the applicable provisions.

Pre Arrival Requirements:

1. Minimum 07 days before embarkation, the application will be submitted through ATITHI 2.0 PORTAL by the applicant along with supported documents

Supporting Documents includes: Vaccination and Microchip certificate, Official Health certificate along with Annexure 2.1.1 signed by competent authority, Air ticket/Airway bill, passport copy etc.

2. After examining the uploaded forms, Advance No Objection Certificate (NOC) will be issued by the concerned Animal Quarantine & Certification Station (AQCS) within 1 working day

3. **On Arrival at the Port of Entry**

1. The AQCS's Staff will carry out physical examination of the cat(s) as per the prescribed format and verify original documents at the port of entry.
2. In case the cat(s) is/are found sound and healthy, final NOC (Annexure 2.5) will be issued at the port of entry itself.
3. In case the cat(s) fails to clear physical examination or exhibits clinical signs of diseases, it will be taken to the Quarantine Station and will remain under quarantine for 15 days.

During Quarantine Period at AQCS

1. Everyday examination record will be maintained and testing will be done. If any signs/symptoms will be found, the same will be recorded or updated online. The applicant will bear the charges for testing.
2. Final NOC (Annexure 1.5) will be issued in case negative test reports are obtained for the dog(s) under quarantine.
3. In case of the positive testing reports or if the pet dies of disease, deportation/Post – Mortem and incineration will be done at the cost of owner.

***Complete clearance process is depicted at annexure 2 (a, b & c)**

Note: If owner of pet(s) is unable to apply for NOC at ATITHI 2.0 personally, he/she may authorize his/her representative (Annexure 1.6).

Process for Importing Pet Cat(s) into India under Transfer of Residence-Ease of Understanding

Case 1. – Transfer of Residence

Application Filing

Minimum 7 working days before embarkation, applicant will submit the following documents on ATITHI 2.0 PORTAL for obtaining Advance No Objection Certificate (NOC) from AQCS. The Cat Should be physically examined within 7 days of the date of shipment.

Before filling application, please make sure that you are eligible for Transfer of Residence (Proof of two years overseas stay and visa cancellation/relocation proof)

Provisional Decision

If documents are proper

Advance No Objection Certificate (Annexure 2.2) along with format for physical examination (Annexure 2.3) is issued and Bill of Entry will be cleared online by AQCS (If coming by cargo)

If there is deficiency in documents

Applicant will be informed back with point wise reasons for rejection on the portal itself.

Airline will not lift the pets until advance NOC is obtained by the applicant.

Post Arrival Examination

AQCS's Staff will examine the animal(s) (Annexure 2.3) and documents

Decision on Arrival at port of entry

FIT- Final NOC
(Annexure 2.5)

Unfit-Animal exhibiting clinical signs of diseases as mentioned in format at annexure 2.3 will be quarantined at respective AQCS (15 days) and necessary testing will be carried out.

Minimum 7 working days before embarkation, applicant will submit the following documents on ATITHI 2.0 PORTAL for obtaining Advance No Objection Certificate (NOC) from AQCS. The Cat Should be physically examined within 7 days of the date of shipment.

Before filling application, please make sure that you are eligible for Reimport (Copy of earlier export certificate issued by AQCS India)

Case 3. – For Short Stay in India (Under DGFT)

Application Filing

Minimum 7 working days before embarkation, applicant will submit the following documents on ATITHI 2.0 PORTAL for obtaining Advance No Objection Certificate (NOC) from AQCS. The Cat Should be physically examined within 7 days of the date of shipment.

Before filling application, please make sure that you have a valid DGFT License (<http://dgftcom.nic.in/eComapplications.html>)
